The Generosity Collective is a Registered Charity. The aim is to improve the quality of life of disadvantaged individuals and families through the provision of specified and quality second-hand and new goods through our registered community members. We are dedicated to providing essential clothing and items to those facing hardship while focusing on supporting a circular economy.

What we do?

Be the vital conduit between Support Workers and Agencies by assisting them to identify their client's specific material needs and gaps in the services currently available to them. Through our dedicated and generous members, we facilitate the donation and delivery process of those material items for the client.

Who we help?

Individuals and families fleeing domestic violence, children living in residential and foster care and adult in psychiatric inpatient units. By developing strong relationships, we respond to agencies and support workers, and facilitate their requests of assistance for their clients in a timely manner.

Why?

Over the years of providing the platform for community members to donate time, money, and goods to various charities, we have identified how generous the human spirit is. However, it has been evident that at times people are not aware of how their small actions have the capacity to have significant impacts on others less fortunate. It is this kindness that we want to continue to harness, to support those in need.

Volunteers

We have a strong volunteer network to assist us in the receiving, sorting and the delivering of donations. We maintain an up-to-date register of all volunteers and provide them with on board training. We ensure all volunteers work within a safe and respectful space.

What is our point of difference to other Charities?

We want to make our donors feel part of a 'Giving Community.' By registering your interest in supporting our charity, we send out alerts to our community on specific items we need. Although we may warehouse some essential items to ensure immediate assistance to those in crisis care, we hope our community holds onto their quality good until they receive a 'call out.'



Sustainability

We want to ensure good quality clothing is reused by people in need rather than sent to landfill. Donations we receive that are not of high quality will be offered to other local not for profit charities. With all remaining items we will endeavour to distribute to local animal welfare agencies such as the RSPCA and animal hospitals.

- Have strong relationships with local agencies, who will guide us on the needs of their clients, whereby we will respond accordingly with essential items.
- Always provide second-hand goods that are highest quality possible.

- To never compete with existing services, rather work within a complimentary framework, continuously striving for the best outcomes for those in need.
- To never profit from the delivery of the service, but rather reinvest any available funds to grow the reach and impact of the service.
